Economic Development

Machine Training

Ralph Bentley, DIT Program Developer and Precision Machine Technology Instructor contracted with the following three companies for customized training.

- Triumph Corporation: 32 hours of Coordinate Measuring Machine (CMM) and Geometric, Dimensioning & Tolerance (GD&T) training. Training will assist the employees to be eligible to bid for jobs in the inspection department. This would lead to a pay increase and promotion for the employee.
- Crane Aerospace: 20 hours of GD&T and 160 hours of Computerized Numerical Control (CNC) training. Twenty employees will be upgrading their skill levels for future pay increases.
- Eaton Corporation: 40 hours of Automatic Bar Machine (ACME Gridley) training. Eaton Corporation requested the training to upgrade the skills of their current workforce. Lorain County JVS is the only facility in Ohio to provide ACME Gridley training.

Welding Training

Russ Beach, Program Developer, coordinated a 40- hour training class with U.S. Steel. The training was designed to upgrade the skills of approximately 15 employees in the maintenance department towards a 6G pipe welding standard. A second class is planned for early June.

At the end of the 40 hours of training the participants will be evaluated for their ability to meet the necessary requirements in passing a 6G pipe certification. The class was held at the U.S. Steel training center in Lorain.
