

## TITLE IV BULLYING STATISTICS

Bullying statistics can be found in the annual Title IV report. Lorain County JVS students and staff participate in programs and events that make a difference in increasing awareness about bullying. These programs reflect the different types of bullying – from verbal and physical bullying to cyber-bullying.

Harassment, Intimidation and Bullying:

Any intentional written, verbal or physical act that a student has exhibited toward another particular student more than once and the behavior both:

- a) Causes mental or physical harm to the other student, and
- b) Is sufficiently severe, persistent, or pervasive that it creates an intimidating, threatening, or abusive educational environment for the other student.
